



Saturday, December 2, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Got up & made out the Biscuit & finished up one of My Hair pin Holders & Crochetted the top for the other Then went over to Mrs M & finished my two jugs Rose at Home Pop down town got a Brown flour All well But colds.

Sunday, December 3, 1893 Weather: Very warm.

The children went to S S Amanda here to dinner Made three pies wrote three letters one to Mary Emma & Queen went for a drive over to see Agnes Wilkie called All well but colds. Rose & Pete gone out

Monday, December 4, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Set Hen. Washed & went over to Mrs M and commenced on my pitcher Zilpha here Agnes Pop & I went down to the Conversational Club on Poultry All well Rose at Home Edna at School. Made cup custard

Tuesday, December 5, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Ironed & made cup cust[ard] went over to work on my pitcher Mrs Johnston gone to N. Y. Started to cut out Ednas dress. Finished all my tooth pick Holders All well but colds Rose at Home. Got letter from Clara

Wednesday, December 6, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Mrs Fox died.¹ Pop got letter from McKay He & I went down town this Morning. Aunty Sinnott took dinner here Started crotchet cut out Ednas dress took the Apron & Tooth pick Holder down to Wilsons Pete & Rose gone out Alice over

Sunday, December 10, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Edna & Alverda went to S. S. I got dinner Rose took Luene down to Church Alverda staid also. All went for a drive & A L Rose & Pete gone out All well but me Luene wore her Cloak & Hood.

Monday, December 11, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Mrs M did Shawl Washed Amandas Hair this Morning over to Mrs Mann finished my pitcher Knit on Skirt Rose down to See about her dress Jen Here. Pop plowed Amanda & Miss Martin called C. R. C. this forenoon All well.

Tuesday, December 12, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

C R C called on Rose Ironed & tried to dye the shawl. Made a white fruit cake Paula came over Mrs Mann came over Mr Shaw over to see Rose Rose at Home Pop plowed All well.

Wednesday, December 13, 1893 Weather: Rain

Got letter from Emma. Made two Spool Holders went over to Mrs W Washed out Pops flannels. Knit on the Skirt Rose sick all day Edna at work on the Apron All well Edna at School

Thursday, December 14, 1893 Weather: Rain

Fixed Alverdas & Luenes dolls ready to dress Finished Ed's Rack and mended the tile put felt on the Bottom of all the jugs. Pop got a letter from Isaac[.] Rose started the Blue Skirt Amanda Here.

Friday, December 15, 1893 Weather: Pleasant

Baked 2 cakes one for the Universal Union one for ourselves Mrs Witmore called Rose the children & I went down to School I went down town with Wilkie & over to Mrs B All well Pop down town.

Saturday, December 16, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Knit on the Skirt finished it went over to Wilkies & to Mrs Manns. Cut out 4 Iron Holders. All well Rose & Pete gone out Mr & Mrs Thistlewaite spent the eve here fixed my skirt Pop brought Home the [can not be read]

Sunday, December 17, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Wrote home to Olie & Clara went for a drive Rose over to Sunday School & out this eve. Children down to Sunday School Mr Dunning spent the evening Here All well but slight colds.

Monday, December 18, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Got up early Mended Pops clothes & washed & fixed Alverda & Ls parasols Buckley children here Ren got dye Worked on Luenes doll clothes Rose at H[ome] All well Pop at trees.

Tuesday, December 19, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Ironed & dyed some more goods. Black. Mrs Mann & baby called Mrs Bliss came over done up Ednas & Alverdas waists Joe Shaw¹ came over. All well but slight colds Rose at Home. Fixed doll shirts

Thursday, December 21, 1893 Weather: Rained nearly all day.

Got the things ready to send off sent Cousin Queen hers .10 up Home .10 cents Mrs W came over at work dressing the dolls. Pop got letter from King with interest Rose & Joe gone out All well Mrs Mann came over.

Friday, December 22, 1893 Weather: Cleared off

Cleaned the Silver and my room Made two caps for the dolls & dressed the other three. Edna over to Mrs Campbells Pop down town took over chairs for Rose Rose & Pete gone out All well.

Saturday, December 23, 1893 Weather: Rain

Got letter from Ola Photo. Pop & I went down town this morning Amanda here for dinner Pop got a Turkey 23 lb 4.15 Ralph here Rose down town Made two felt Holders & fixed Luenes Hair & slippers for A & Luene. Rose & Pete gone out. All well Made Ednas chain.

Sunday, December 24, 1893 Weather: Rain & Wind

Got up early Made 3 Mince Pies 2 cakes frosted & dressed the turkey fixed the pumpkin for Pie Made dressing. Wrote to Emma & Cousin Sallie. Bertha came in for the Popper Rose & Pete gone out All well Peter here brought carving

Monday, December 25, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Rose & Pete gone out Got up early Made three pumpkin pies & got dinner Mr & Mrs T Mr D & Ralph here for dinner Mrs M gave me a cheese delight & Rens Photo. Mrs W & Agnes gave me a fancy Balloon Rose a cup & saucer Amanda here

Tuesday, December 26, 1893 Weather: Rained all day

Made Edna two pairs of Drawers Mrs Witmore came in Got my souvienere spoon from Clara. All well Took off the old Hen got nine little chickens Rose at Home Rained all day.

Washed & worked button Holes in one pair of Ednas pants went over to Mrs M also over to Wilkies Pop down town got coffee Rose at Home All well children over to B. Edna started crochet

Thursday, December 28, 1893 Weather: Clear

Commenced to teach the children Ironed & done the mending. Pop went over to town & bought his 2 suits of underware \$5.00 I took the children over to Mrs Millers All well. Bertha over here Rose & Pete gone out Made Button Holes in Ednas drawer

Friday, December 29, 1893 Weather: Clear

Cleaned up My Room fine Went over to Mrs Wilkies Evans Escaped from jail in Fresno All well Rose at Home All day Knitt on my Skirt Pop went down town Fixed my scissors pin cushion.

Saturday, December 30, 1893 Weather: Cold Frosty nights

Mrs Everts called. Ice for the first time cleaned up the Parlor & front bed room. Mrs Levette called I went down to Mrs Fitches & to Mrs Hughes All well Rose at Home Po down town Had my shoe [can not be read].

Sunday, December 31, 1893 Weather: Cloudy

Got up early made three Mince Pies one lofe[sic] and one layer cake All the children to S. S. I went down to church & over to W. Pop took the children for a walk W called Rose & Pete gone out All well Popped some corn Wind Rain this evening Made 2 pumpkin Pies frosted 2 cakes made a chicken pie took a Bath Inez W called also Agnes I popped some corn Rose at Home Started crochet over to W & to Mrs M All Well.
